NCTB Musical Selections for the 2011 Concert Season

Our summer concert programs show promise of an enjoyable and entertaining variety of music. The New Cumberland Town Band will continue to provide programs in the tradition of community bands.

The center of our concerts will continue to be the marches both of American masters such as Sousa, Fillmore, and Huffine. These marches will be interspersed throughout the programs, contrasting with the different styles and moods.

Tribute selections have been planned for the American greats, including Henry Mancini, Glenn Miller, Ray Charles, John Williams, and the Carpenters.

Also, continuing a tradition will be the inclusion of a ballad or hymn on each concert. Some of the titles we are rehearsing are, "A Quiet Moment," "Ashokan Farewell," and "Shenandoah."

Novelty selection will include "Pachinko", a descriptive piece imitating a Japanese pin ball machine. It features the percussion section. Another selection will be "The Whistler and His Dog." It was written by Arthur Pryor, an early 20th Century band composer of music for the summer band idiom.

The New Cumberland Town Band has many very talented soloists. A newly composed number, "Theme and Variations for Alto Saxophone" will be premiered featuring Donna Deaven. There will also be several trumpet features, including "Macarena," "Wonderland by Night," and "Serenade," by Franz Shubert.

The programs will offer interesting overtures by contemporary American composers as well as one or two orchestra transcriptions.

Continuing our long tradition, we will begin our concert season with a joint concert with the West Shore Youth Band. We enjoy beginning both organizations' season together.

All in all, the programs will bring the dynamic sound of a summer's evening concert with both familiar and new music which we expect will appeal to a wide range of adult listeners.
